

Cobell Scholarships: Counselor One-Sheet

A quick guide to eligibility, annual application windows, and the steps students must complete in OASIS.

Who may be a general fit

Enrolled members of a U.S. federally recognized Tribe or Alaska Native Corporation who plan to attend an eligible nonprofit public or private postsecondary institution and pursue a matched degree, certificate, or fellowship.

What the student must do

Create and own the OASIS account, complete the Applicant Profile, submit the Eligibility Form, open the matched Opportunity Application, and submit it by the deadline.

How a counselor can help

Help build a timeline, confirm school and degree information, proofread for clarity, and complete a reference promptly when requested. The student should write and submit their own responses.

ANNUAL APPLICATION WINDOWS

Six opportunities. One place to begin.

Students start in OASIS. Exact cycle dates, times, and requirements posted there control.

Undergraduate Scholarship

AA, BA, or BS; reference required

DEC 15 - MAR 31

Vocational / Trade School Scholarship

Certificate, diploma, AAS, or trade-focused AA; no reference

JUN 1 - MAY 15

Graduate & Professional Scholarship

Graduate, professional, post-baccalaureate; letter required

DEC 15 - MAR 31

Summer Scholarship

Any degree level; no reference

FEB 15 - MAY 4

Graduate Summer Research Fellowship

Degree-relevant graduate research; academic reference

SEP 1 - JAN 10

Elouise Cobell Dissertation Writing Year Fellowship

Dissertation writing/defense year; chair recommendation

SEP 1 - JAN 10

Make the next step clear.

- Use the student's personal email and exact legal name.
- Confirm Tribal/ANC, institution, degree, and graduation details.
- Add deadlines and remember: Profile + Eligibility is not the application.
